**Explanation of Changes:** Public Safety was increased due to unexpected equipment purchases by the Fire Department. Miscellaneous Revenue are contributions given to the Fire Dept. The water infrastructure project has engineering expenses that are counterbalanced with an SRF P&D loan. Community and Economic Development reimburses a homeowner for use of the Urban Revitalization Program.
